NSGA Registration: The resort's front desk will direct you to our Registration Desk, open from 5pm - 6pm on your arrival day. A complete welcome packet will await you with a schedule of activities, tournament rules, tee times, golf pairings, your name badge, and other important information. Handicaps will be verified at this time, so have your card ready. If you arrive late, your welcome packet will be left at the resort's front desk.

3-Day Tournament Format: The tournament will include golf for three days. Golfers will participate in a 54-hole medal play tournament utilizing the player's USGA-recognized full handicap. Prizes will be awarded to the men's, super senior men's and ladies' Overall Low Gross and Low Net winners. Long Drive and Closest to the Pin contests will be held.

Payment: **Final payment for this event is due to NSGA by February 1.** A down payment of 33% of the anticipated total is due at booking. Payment can be charged directly to any major credit card by calling NSGA at 800-282-6772. At the conclusion of the event, you will be expected to pay the resort directly for any incidental expenses incurred during your stay.

Credits/ Refunds: A full, no-questions-asked refund is available until February 1. A partial refund is available after February 1. After February 1, the refund amount is based upon the date of cancellation, the amount that NSGA has already spent and the cause of the cancellation. These refunds may be in the form of an NSGA credit towards a future event.

Charleston City Tour

The history of the state of South Carolina —and of the entire South—is exemplified by the stately houses and the postcard-perfect streets of Charleston. The first English settlement in South Carolina, Charles Towne was named for King Charles II. We will tour Charleston's old mansions, gardens, the French Quarter, Rainbow Row, Slave Market, with a stop at the famed Battery overlooking Fort Sumter and the Pirate's Gallows.

The Spa

The Ocean Course

25 on Golf Digest's "America's 100 Greatest Golf Courses/2009-10"

The Ocean Course at Kiawah Island Golf Resort will host the 2012 PGA Championships. At that time it will become only the fourth course to host each of the PGA of America's major championships.



Built in 1991 by Pete Dye, there are no prevailing winds on the course. Dye took this into account when designing the course. In fact, he designed two courses into one – one for an easterly wind and one for a westerly wind. Located on the eastern-most end of Kiawah Island, The Ocean Course has more seaside holes than any other course in the Northern Hemisphere – 10 right along the Atlantic with the other 8 running parallel to those.

Although it was originally designed to sit behind the dunes, Dye's wife, Alice, suggested raising the entire course to allow players unobstructed views of Kiawah's beautiful Atlantic coastline from every hole. This improved view, however, made the course substantially more demanding as it also exposed it to the area's brisk and unpredictable sea breezes.

The Ocean Course gained instant notoriety as the host of the "War by the Shore," a battle decided literally by the final putt of Sunday's final match in 1991's Ryder Cup Matches. The PGA Professional National Championship was played in June 2005. Also, the Ocean Course made its big screen debut in November 2000 when the movie "The Legend of Bagger Vance" opened at theaters nation-wide.

With 18 holes offering panoramic views of the Atlantic Ocean, it is likely The Ocean Course would have earned widespread acclaim had no tournament ever been played there.

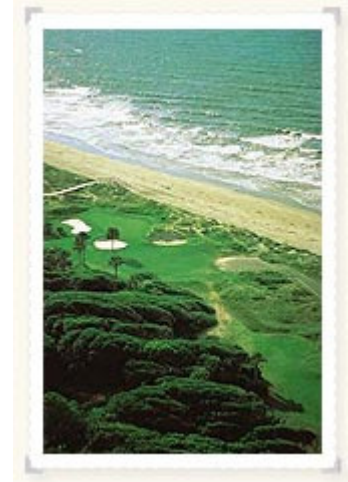

Turtle Point

Opened in 1981, Turtle Point is a low-profile design with fairways and green settings blended into the existing landscape. Nowhere is this more evident than along a spectacular three-hole stretch woven through rolling sand dunes directly along the Atlantic Ocean.

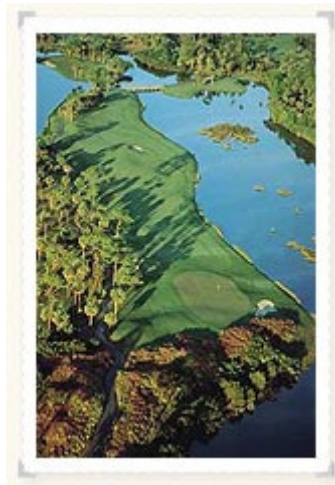
The Turtle Point Course features tree-lined fairways and numerous lagoons coming into play. This course is highlighted by three spectacular ocean-side holes. The fairways are narrow, and the small greens are well bunkered. The signature hole is #15, a 412-yard, par 4, requiring shots up a narrow fairway lined on the left side by the Atlantic Ocean and sand dunes, and a prevailing southeast wind can also create problems.

Osprey Point



Designed by the consensus pick as the best contemporary architect in golf, Tom Fazio has left his mark on Kiawah. At Osprey Point, Fazio used a superb natural canvas to create a masterpiece in playability and variety. The setting for the course features four large, natural lakes, fingers of saltwater marsh, and dense maritime forests of live oaks, pines, palmettos, and magnolias. Into that backdrop, Fazio blended a par-72 layout that takes advantage of its setting. Ranked in Golf Digest's "America's Top 75 Resort Courses," Osprey Point has grown into one of the favorite courses on the island.

The Osprey Point Course is one of the most scenic of the Kiawah courses and also the most forgiving. The fairways are open, and the large greens are undulating. This course winds through the eastern end of the island and has lagoons that come into play on some holes. There are water hazards that come into play on fifteen holes. Some of the natural settings include lagoons, marshes, and a forest of pine, palmetto, oak and magnolia trees.
